Massachusetts Team Wins 2022 National You Be The Chemist Challenge®

Team members earn scholarships after wowing industry panel

ARLINGTON, VA – The Chemical Educational Foundation[®] (CEF) announces a team of four students from Massachusetts, the Chemistry Enthusiasts, who rose to the top of 9,000 students to win the 2022 National *You Be The Chemist* Challenge and a \$12,000 scholarship. When asked what advice they have for future participants, student Srinidhi Iyer said, "It is most important to just have fun, be confident, manage time well and efficiently, and never see the Challenge as a test but rather a major opportunity to grow as a young chemist in the making."



Chemistry Enthusiasts is one of the teams of fifth- through eighthgraders who participated in the Challenge this year, including in Regional events where they answered 40 questions and produced a 3–5-minute video on states of matter in space.
